



The Old Site of Mr. Kurando Terashima's House



This samurai residence and garden display what life was like in the middle of the Edo period.

Kurando Terashima was a retainer of the Kaga clan as well as a painter in the middle of the Edo period. The house, storehouse and earthen walls are typical of the life of a middle-class retainer. The Japanese garden with a pond in its center has been designated as a historic site by Kanazawa City.



Yoshiro and Yoshio Taniguchi Museum of Architecture, Kanazawa

Disseminating Kanazawa's architectural culture and urban design to the world

This museum of architecture and urban design was designed by the world-renowned architect Yoshio Taniguchi. It stands on the site of the former residence of Yoshiro Taniguchi, Yoshio's father, who is an established architect and the first honorary citizen of Kanazawa City. Among its displays is a replica of Yoshiro Taniguchi's famous work, "Yushintei", the Japanese-style annex



of the State Guest House Akasaka Palace. Visitors can see architectural works of both Taniguchi architects, as well as learn about Kanazawa's multi-layered architectural culture.
